## **Summary of the Event (max: 300 words):**

Digital Simulation techniques have been enhanced in the European e-participation project (FUPOL - www.fupol.eu) to encourage citizens to participate in the decision making process of the municipalities for the design of urban policies. The huge risk inherent in urban planning design, due mainly to poor understanding of the real needs of citizens in the short and long term, can be mitigated by transforming citizen opinions into valuable knowledge through a trial-and-error approach supported by simulation.

Initial short presentations introduced the FUPOL platform and how simulation tools could be used as serious games in order to let citizens transform present opinions to valuable knowledge for urban planners. The trial and error methodology that characterises the user simulation platforms helps citizens to learn and move from present emotional discussions through social networks to rational discussions that could contribute to minimising the risk in the decision making process.

After these presentations we started a discussion about e-participation, e-governance and the use of the FUPOL platform and simulation tools to help the decision making process in local and national governments.

The key objectives of the presented work are:

- 1.- to move one step forward to foster the e-participation process of citizens in the urban policy planning.
- 2.- to develop a shared approach through the use of information and

communication technologies to deal with a collaborative decision making in the urban planning process between the different stakeholders together with the citizens.

3.- to generate a holistic knowledge of the urban planning problem in which citizens could understand the interdependencies between city infrastructure and resources, city processes, and citizens needs.

The thematic relevance of the workshop to the habitat iii is based on one of its main objectives: the development of mechanisms to allow citizens participation in the decision making, which is also one of the key areas, specified in habitat iii, that impact on housing and on achieving sustainable development goals in urban areas.

### **Summary of the Discussion (max: total 500 words):**

The audience were very interested in the entire FUPOL platform and also with the simulation models already developed for it. There was one claim from several people, which was the impossibility to see the results during the session. The FUPOL platform is still under development and the simulation models are developed; however, the final software is also under development yet, and the results we could show were graphics and conclusions.
