The future cities must be sustainable. In the past 30 years, China has experienced a fast growth of urbanisation. More than half of population in China is now urban. New cities and new towns are booming. But lots of urban issues such as transport congestion, environmental degrading, empty new towns, etc. are also emerging. Echoing the UNEP’s call for developing a green economy in the urban realm, a transition to green cities is a must to Chinese cities, no matter mega-cities, medium cities or small ones. The central government of China called for developing a new type of urbanisation in China and eco-civilisation is also listed as a national policy. With this background, this event introduces the new concept of green city, tools to assess green cities and examples of green cities in China.
