Summary of the Event (max: 300 words):

This event focused on the concept of measuring cities' prosperity, identifying where cities in the developing countries stand today according to various dimensions and indicators, and what kind of efforts are they deploying to progress in the prosperity path to ensure an equitable urban development process. The event also highlighted the importance of streets as public spaces and drivers for prosperity, and the key findings that was published in a recent publication issued by the UN-Habitat with the same title.

The event zoomed into the experience of Egypt in applying and contextualizing the index to adapt to the different needs and priorities at the national, regional, and city levels. In addition, emphasis will be made to the key challenges encountered during the different phases of developing the index, especially during the estimation of the Index, preparation of diagnosis and action plans at city and regional levels, and the selection and inclusion of good practices and policies.

A facilitated discussion also organized on how the enhance the development of a strategy to communicate the findings and lessons learned among the different stakeholders, and among key other countries planning to start the process of developing the index.


