Summary of the Discussion (max: total 500 words):

1. Outline of the discussion/debates

The main objective of the event was to discuss the sustainability of public interventions in slums after construction is concluded. Panellists discussed Brazilian and Colombian models of urban transformations and initiatives to improve life conditions in slums. The president of IPP, Eduarda La Rocque, discussed municipal investments in the pacified slums of Rio de Janeiro, which amount to \$700 million since 2009. She emphasised the achievements of the municipal health and education policies, such as the Family Health Program and the Child Development Spaces, and explained the role of the UPP Social Program in integrating the municipality’s policies for slum upgrading. Oscar Montoya, of Medellin’s Urban Development Company (EDU), stressed the importance of continuity regarding urban transformation policies and improved access to public services such as the cable cars installed in slums of both Medellin and Rio de Janeiro. Ruth Jurberg and Ícaro Moreno of the State Government of Rio de Janeiro discussed the social component of the Brazilian Growth Acceleration Program (PAC Social), housing projects in three favelas





of Rio de Janeiro, and the need to improve street infrastructure given that alleyways with 60cm of width can be found in Rio's slums.

The discussions touched upon issues related to several thematic branches of UN-Habitat, including Land, Legislation and Governance, Urban Economy, Urban Planning and Design.

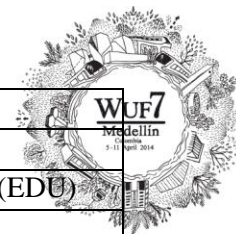
It became evident that there is potential for technical cooperation between Medellin and Rio de Janeiro to improve delivery of public services in slums.
